2020 became a year of silver linings, allowing our teams to revive the volunteer newsletter, now called the Volunteer Hub, and Youth Allies Program for high school students.

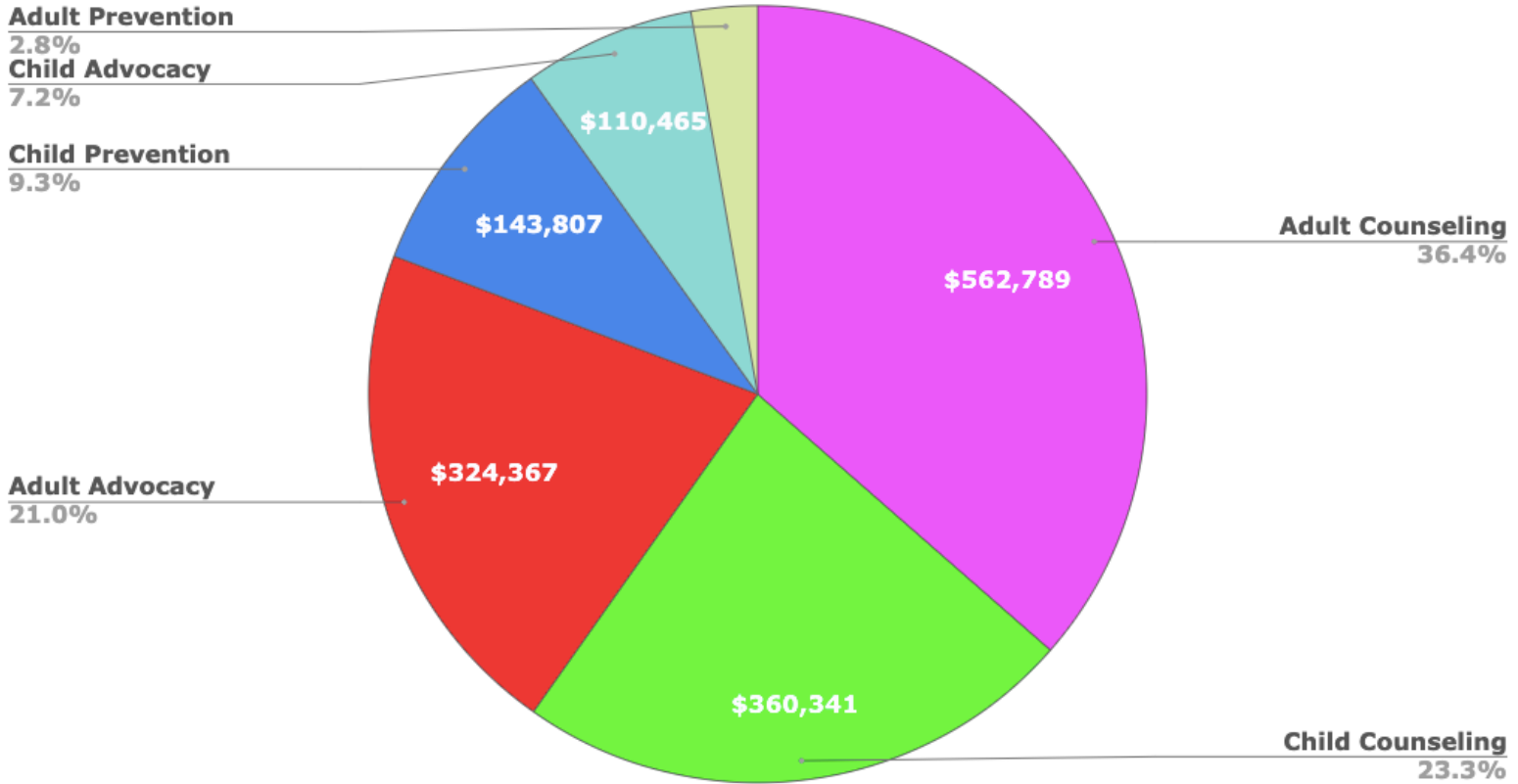


When in person events were difficult, we offered Facebook Live events for the public and migrated to virtual fundraising, keeping us connected to the community and to our generous donors.
