## Writing / Creative Pieces; School Activities

- **Activism Flags** (Prompts such as: "I Will Use My Voice For..." "I'm Working to End Sexual Violence So That..." "I'm Part of the Solution When...")
- **Write to an elected official** in their local community to explain why or why not they support a specific law, HB, etc.
- **Completing an artwork piece to honor survivors** (look at using different mediums such as color pencils, clay, whatever school has on hand, etc..) and then displaying it at school (maybe in the library)
- **Schedule a film/video/reading night** pertaining to sexual violence and host discussion afterward about it
- **Set up window displays at school** (also appropriate for high school)
